RE: Swimming Victoria's Proposed Changes to District Borders

Dear Mr Hellwig, 

On behalf of Metro West Swimming Victoria Incorporated, known as Metro West District, I am writing to object to Swimming Victoria's recent proposal to alter the setup of the metropolitan & rural swimming districts throughout the state.

We are in full support of the response submitted by Greg Langford, Metro East, on behalf of all metropolitan districts, and are extremely grateful for the work he completed to highlight some of the core issues with Swimming Victoria's proposal. Our submission is to further some of the points Greg has raised in his submission, while giving a western suburbs context.

As you know, Metro West District covers a range of local government areas stretching from the inner west & north-west, out to the metropolitan hubs of Wyndham & Melton. Many of these local government areas are amongst the most disadvantaged according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics SEIFA ranking (Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas). I highlight this in the context of swimming being a more inaccessible sport for those who are economically disadvantaged, and therefore the potential lack of future growth within our district despite population increases. Our district also suffers from a distinct lack of water space compared to other metropolitan districts, again stymying our potential for future growth.

These factors already contribute to a clear disparity in member numbers & competitive swimmer numbers in our district, as shown below:

Despite such a clear disparity between our numbers and those of other districts, the proposal before us then recommends removing six clubs from our current affiliation of 17 clubs (including several with sizable competitive numbers in the context of our district). The proposal does have one club moving into our district, being Swimland Swimming Club (at present 128 competitive members).

However, as highlighted by Greg Langford in the metropolitan submission, a significant portion of Swimland Swimming Club competitive members reside around their Rowville, Carrum Downs & Narre Warren training facilities, and it would be fraught to suggest these members would be willing to travel to the extremities of the western suburbs to compete at district meets. The reality would be either the fracturing of Swimland Swimming Club into a number of different clubs, or these swimmers leaving Swimland Swimming Club to join another local club.

When factoring in the removal of the competitive members of these six clubs, while adding the Swimland Swimming Club competitive members that reside in the western suburbs, our district's competitive swimmer count would drop below 500. This number would start to make many of our competitions unviable, particularly the selection trials held on behalf of Swimming Victoria (being the Optus Junior Dolphin Meet & All Junior Meet) where we already don't field a complete quota of athletes in each event. Our number of clubs would also be almost half of two of the other proposed districts, again putting the west at a significant disadvantage despite the intention of this proposal being to provide better equity amongst the districts.

While a loss of over a third of our clubs and the further decimation of our competitive swimmers are our key concerns, some of the other impacts this proposal would have on our district include:

- The loss of several clubs with a longstanding history with Metro West District dating back 20+ years (including AquaWolves, Sunbury, Essendon District Aquatic, Hume City)
- The subsequent loss of Metro West Life Members currently affiliated with clubs listed above
- The removal of Broadmeadows Leisure Centre from our district, currently the home of Metro West Swimming where we hold our Optus Junior Dolphins Selection Trials, All Junior Selection Trials & Metro West District Championships
- The alienation of the outer north-western clubs currently in our district (AquaWolves & Sunbury would move to Metro Central despite geographically being closer to the western cluster of clubs rather than those in Metro Central)

As a District we understand that as clubs come and go, and competitive swimmer numbers increase or decrease in certain areas, that adjustments need to take place. However we believe that this complete redrawing of the metropolitan district boundaries fails to take into consideration the current state of swimming in Melbourne's western suburbs, our already low competitor numbers, the limitations for growth in the more-disadvantaged western suburbs, and the long-standing history of our clubs.

I trust that you will take these concerns onboard when making any future decisions about this matter, and should you need any further information in regards to this submission or any other matter, please don't hesitate to get in touch. Our Management Committee is always willing to host representatives of Swimming Victoria at our Delegates Meetings, and/or convene a special meeting of our Management Committee to discuss matters pertaining to the district.

Metro West District wholeheartedly believes that positive outcomes can be achieved through proper & thorough consultation with districts, and believe that having districts at the table helping shape the future of our sport, can only be a positive for swimming in Victoria, as well as Swimming Victoria.

SWIMMING VICTORIA METROPOLITAN DISTRICTS RESPONSE TO PROPOSED ALTERATIONS TO DISTRICT BOUNDARIES

1.0 BACKGROUND

In November 2018 Swimming Victoria (SV) released a discussion paper seeking feedback from districts and clubs concerning proposed district border realignments.

The new model proposes to reduce country districts from 10 to 6, and increase metropolitan districts from 4 to 5. The proposal also involves realignment to district boundaries, with many metropolitan clubs being affiliated to alternative districts.

The SV rationale for the proposal is primarily given to be Administrative (duplicated entity names, changes to club headquarter pools) and Structural (nominated districts in Bylaws are outdated, equalisation of district numbers to create equity in SV organised district competitions).

SV require a response by 13th December 2018 in order to implement changes to the new CRM (Customer Relations Management) system effective 1st July 2019.

The proposal was presented to all districts at the SV council meeting on 25th November 2018. The four Metropolitan districts (Metro South, Metro West, Metro North and Metro East) expressed concerns about the proposed changes to their districts, and agreed to provide a unified response.

The purpose of this paper is to provide SV with a co-ordinated common response from the 4 Metropolitan districts. Country districts are providing a response by district as a separate paper to this.

2.0 OVERVIEW

The new model proposes to significantly alter the composition and numbers of metropolitan districts as follows;

- increase Metropolitan Districts from 4 to 5
- creation of a new district called Metro South East
- nominally rename Metro North as Metro Central
- substantially alter each districts member clubs and swimmer numbers by boundary reallocation.

Districts club and competitive swimmer* member numbers will be significantly altered as follows;

*NOTE: Competitive swimmers are registered competitive swimmers by club. Total Members include Non-Swimmers, Life Members, Recreational Swimmers and Officials. Competitive swimmers are most relevant here as the proposal objective is to create equity in swimming competitions.

Analysis of club and member numbers within existing and proposed districts reveal the following anomalies;

- The two largest districts (Metro East and the new Metro South East) will now comprise 52% of total Metropolitan swimmers
- Remaining 48% of competitive swimmers are shared by Metro West, South and Central
- Metro West swimmers will comprise only 12% of total Metropolitan swimmers (many from disadvantaged areas), even less allowing for the Swimland effect (refer below)
- Metro West largest club will be Swimland, which is dispersed geographically in West, East and South. North and East Swimland swimmers are unlikely to participate in District competitions in the West.
- Metro West club numbers are overstated due to including 4 clubs that have evolved from one club.
- Metro North/Central members comprise 60% from Vicentre and Northcote. Remaining North/Central clubs are relatively small.
- Despite boundary alterations, Metro East club numbers are unchanged, and competitive swimmer numbers have materially increased due to club reallocations primarily from Metro North
- Metro South have a massive reduction of clubs by 48% and competitive swimmer numbers by 56%.

3.0 CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

The proposal to move from 4 Metropolitan Districts to 5 Districts does not resolve inequity of clubs and swimmers between Districts. Creating 'Super Districts' of East and South East, together with significantly reducing the size of other Districts such as West and South will result in dysfunctional, inoperative and commercially unviable Districts. Rolling smaller clubs from Districts such as North, West and South into Districts heavily represented by a number of larger clubs makes it unlikely swimmers from smaller clubs will gain representation in District Teams.

Despite the current model having South with a disproportionate number of clubs and swimmers, all districts accept this as a workable and acceptable arrangement under the current constraints. Recent developments with Vicentre may alter this situation.

The creation of an additional Metropolitan District and realignment of District boundaries presents many significant operational, functional and viability risks for Districts and very little benefit in moving to the new model.

Accordingly, all SV Metropolitan Districts (South, West, North and East) are unanimous in rejecting the proposal and strongly recommend continuing with the current model and boundaries.
